Why Privacy is so Crucial to Protect

Most people do not understand why they need to protect their privacy – they aren't doing anything wrong or criminal, so why hide?

The fact of the matter is that this kind of thinking is based on an assumption that no one would try to do any harm to us, based on our choices, and that no one would try to force us to do certain things we have no obligations to do...

This assumption is naïve, at best – and outright ignorant and stupid, at worst.

No government accepts any obligation to protect its citizens against other people doing wrong to them. You don't get far by blaming the government for the burglary you had!

There is also no government on Planet Earth that does not have a serious interest in collecting money from its own citizens, called taxes. No government can fleece other Nations' citizens, though – their powers are restricted to their own.

But governments do indeed create a powerful span of webs to keep people entrapped as slaves, most often in direct conflict with the country's Constitution, and definitely in conflict with UN's Human Rights Declaration, which basically all countries accepted to incorporate in their own legislation in 1966 – and very few have done.

How government forces people to volunteer slavery...

Now, the Human Rights Declaration has no legal power on its own – but it sure serves as a valuable reference for what is right and what is not, when it comes to abuse of people in order to control them effectively enough to make them pay the desired taxes.

Forcing people to give up their earnings or a part of their earnings as "tax" is plain simply slavery – or part-time slavery, at best. No government which ratified the Human Rights Declaration has any legitimate rights to enslave its citizens. This means that tax on personal income, earned through personal labor, is unlawful!

Privacy is not directly mentioned in the Declaration as a human right. But it is a necessary prerequisite for all governments to honor, in order to protect those human rights! So, privacy is, in a way, even more fundamental than the Human Rights Declaration itself.

It is easy to understand this when you consider holding a democratic election in a country that is subject to internal armed conflicts. If you cannot exercise your rights to vote *in privacy* – then you might not dare to make the decisions you find are right for *you*. In other words, without privacy, there cannot be any protection of your fundamental rights to decide whom you want to elect with your vote!

But it does not take armed conflicts to violate our fundamental rights.... *Financial restrictions* will suffice!

Money controls weapons – so, when you control the money, you also control the weapons...

The real problem is that a tax-greedy government is not interested in providing protection for its citizen *against its own abuse of them!!!*

This does not negate the need for privacy. It only accentuates it. And it makes it less-than-simple to obtain it!

There are ways, though.

Telling the difference between capacities and jurisdictions

The most important thing to understand before we can discuss those ways is that government achieves its goals by forcing people to enter into “volunteer” contracts with the government, and those contracts always include clauses that make the contractor, the private citizen, waive his/her constitutional rights! Breach of such a contract now constitutes a crime – as all fraudulent contracts do, also in accordance with the Human Rights Declaration and any legal principles for just about any country! Very smart...

Unfortunately, fighting this system, all the way through daily life, is cumbersome, at best. Life is indeed easier when we just “comply with the system” and accept the abuse... And that’s exactly what government wants to achieve!

But this does not eliminate our fundamental rights, and it does not make us forfeit our rights to claim and use what we are indeed entitled to!

PRIVACY is one of those fundamental rights...

We have no obligation to disclose to government what truly is none of the government’s business. Let’s discuss then what is “the government’s business”.

First, for government as well as for its citizens, the law of the country, in particular the country’s Constitution, must be respected by all parties. The Constitution gives the rules that government must obey.

Next, government does indeed have a right to enforce an agreement it made with a citizen, and the citizen cannot use as excuse that he/she did not read “the small print” or check the references! This means that, if you signed an agreement with your government, then you’d better honor that agreement.

Finally, no government has any rights to meddle into the jurisdiction of other sovereign Nations, and no government has any rights to restrict its citizens from interacting with other people in other countries.

That's enough! We do not need more in order to protect our privacy! But we also cannot make do with much less.

Building our ID – in privacy

In order for us to avoid having to refer to those agreements we signed with our government (called "tax returns", "registration forms", "applications" etc.), we have to act in a different capacity than the one given to us by government, in the form of a corporation that carries our name. We have to act in our capacity of a *sovereign individual* – and we have to do so by using the legislation of a *foreign* country, so we keep matters *outside* our government's jurisdiction.

If you want to start from scratch, doing this all on your own, you are in for a formidable task – and you will most likely fail. You *cannot* do this on your own, without ending up finding yourself in violation of those government agreements you signed, unless you take the full consequences of "completely opting out of society". You need other people's help, in order for you to create such a different ID you can use for action without accepting liabilities for it, and without linking it to your government-created corporation in your own name – which gives your government a *legitimate* claim to it!

This basically means that whatever you do in your own name is controlled by your government. You cannot use your own name, if you want privacy. And this means that your freedom is linked to your NOT using your own name to manage your financial affairs!

This sounds like a big paradox – but it only is to those who do not understand that *control* has nothing to do with *ownership*. Said John D. Rockefeller, "I want to *own nothing*, control everything." You'd better think he knew what he was talking about...

You can do the same! And, if you value your freedom you *will* do the same...

What it takes?

This: that you **obtain control over an artificially created paper-person that is granted rights by law to act in the financial world as if it were a live person.**

Having such another ID available in a different jurisdiction, one that has no links back to your current government-owned ID, is the way to go.

Because of the issue with jurisdiction, the laws referred to here have to be the laws of a different country than your own. And because of the potential conflict with the agreements you signed with your government, you cannot obtain the desired control *through ownership* of this new ID! If you ignore this advice, you expose yourself to crime charges by being in breach of those agreements you signed with your government...

The traps you must avoid at any price...

There are several important consequences of this, and you should be very careful about not falling into any of these traps:

- You *cannot order* the paper-person to be established, neither directly nor indirectly, through an agent.
- You *cannot pay for* the establishment of that paper-person, except if you pay with hard cash! If you make use of any *bank account in your own name*, you are acting in your capacity of the government-created corporation carrying your name – and you are liable to report everything about the transaction to the government... that means, you have NO PRIVACY!
- You *cannot enter into any signed contracts* or agreements that protect your interest in controlling this paper-person, because, once again, the existence of such a document also confirms your liability to your government!

In the past, it was possible to ignore this – because government did not have the means to actually *check* your actions, worldwide! That has changed. Any government now has ample possibilities for checking what you do within the public banking system, and it has unlimited financial resources available to find you, catch you, and prosecute you for breach of the agreements you made with it!

Obviously, you need to be observant of your enemy's powers – and you need to abstain from breaking agreements you made with him in the past!

There are good solutions to this. And there are bad solutions to it. The bad ones ignore the above and deceive people into thinking that they can hide in a glass box... The good ones start *educating* you, so you understand this stuff in all the detail you need, so that you can indeed make some diligent decisions about how you have to go about getting control over that foreign ID you need in order to protect your privacy.

There are many ways in which you can get this education, except those you most likely would prefer: the ones that are free of charge!

Getting the education you need...

You need to realize that no one has any interest in giving you the education you need in order to enjoy your freedom – unless you have something to give back. Government, of course, will not allow this kind of education anywhere in the public school system! Or anywhere else, where the government has a say... And that includes everything that involves a professional business, because those professional businesses are easy for government to close down, if they work to the government's detriment! You can include all lawyers, all accountants, and all financial advisors in this. You can also include any business operating on the soil of the USA or the UK.

This does not leave many "experts" you can trust... But it does show you whom you should *not* trust!

When government does not want to give you this information, and all professional businesses would commit financial suicide if they dare to do it, then there is very little left, and no one who can provide anything of decent value for *nothing*...

This means that you must accept that this education is *not free*. The people who provide it must have *something* in return for spending their time and energy on educating *you*, otherwise they cannot sustain their activity, and “freedom” remains a secret for the rich. So, please accept for a fact of life that there are fees to pay for this.

How much?

That certainly depends, but a relevant budget would be some US\$2,000-10,000, subject to the specific areas you want to dig into and the number of mistakes you made in the past that now have to be rectified, and that particularly goes for people who have accumulated serious assets in their own name.

This also means that it is within what anyone can do, if the desire is there for an independent financial future. Of course, for people who are looking for some salary slavery to secure their future, there is no hope. Employment is incompatible with freedom. We talk about people who are willing to make a contribution to other people's welfare, in the form of selling goods and or services on a free sovereign basis, to a free sovereign market. If you have nothing to contribute to the market, then do not expect that the market has anything to contribute to you!

But, once you figured out what you can indeed contribute, in the form of services, products, or investments, then it is not difficult to organize things in ways that benefit your foreign ID, and *not* your government-owned ID – and that is what it takes for you to operate in financial freedom!

So it leads back to privacy – as you see, the whole freedom thing hinges on your ability to protect your privacy...
